Cases are listed in the order the court expects them to be ready for trial; schedules of counsel *may* be taken into account in setting particular dates within the 60-day period, but accommodation will be not be guaranteed. 48-hours notice (or more if possible) is normally provided for calling a docketed case to trial. Criminal cases take priority and may result in delays. Some cases may be shown with final pretrial ("FPT") dates or trial ("TD") dates already established.

**Counsel are expected to talk with each other - not the court's case manager -** to be informed about the status of settlement negotiations, etc., in other cases and the resulting likelihood of moving up on the trial priority list. Case #2 moves to #1 if case #1 settles, so the last case on the list could be the only one remaining for trial and thus called to trial earlier than counsel might otherwise expect.
