ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

The Clerk of Court has obtained voter registration lists, lists of licensed drivers and residents holding state identification cards for the six counties which make up the Ann Arbor Division: Jackson, Lenawee, Monroe, Oakland, Washtenaw and Wayne.

It appearing that the current Ann Arbor Master Jury Wheel will expire on April 21, 2013, the Clerk, pursuant to Sections (e) and (h) of the Juror Selection Plan for the Eastern District of Michigan, has determined that a minimum of 100,000 names will be selected at random to create a new Ann Arbor Master Jury Wheel. For the purpose of determining proportional representation in the Ann Arbor Master Jury Wheel, the number of registered voters in each county will be used. Once the proportional representation has been computed, the number of names to be randomly selected from each county will be calculated.


