Local Rule 83.11(b)(4) and Administrative Order 06-AO-015 govern the redistribution and reassignment of civil cases in this Court.

Currently, the Court has 12 full-caseload judges and 6 senior judges with fifty percent caseloads. The average number of pending civil cases for a full-caseload judge is 216. The number is calculated by adding the pending civil cases for general civil cases, social security cases, and special civil cases for all active district judges as of February 29, 2024.

IT IS ORDERED that the clerk will proceed, as provided in Section B of Administrative Order 06-AO-015, to identify by random method 181 cases, 11 general civil cases and 2 special civil cases from each Southern Division full-caseload judge, and 5 general civil cases and 1 special civil case from each Southern Division senior district judge. The Northern Division judge will identify by random method 2 special civil cases for reassignment. The total number of reassigned cases will be 362.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the magistrate judges previously assigned to these cases will not be changed because of the reassignment of these civil cases.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that notices of reassignment in each case will be sent to attorneys of record and parties not represented by counsel as soon as practicable.
